Course Description:

Using project-based instruction, students are introduced to the principles of business in the 21st Century while developing their keyboarding skills. This course is comprised of a series of instructional modules designed to provide hands-on instruction in basic keyboarding skills, digital literacy, computer concepts and software applications.

Grading Scheme:

Formal Assessments......65% Informal Assessments.....35%

The teacher will conduct frequent and ongoing evaluations of student's class work. Tests, quizzes, and written assignments will be used to determine the student's grade. Make-up work is the student's responsibility. Assignments will be provided for all excused absences. Students will be provided the opportunity to retake formal assessments below 80%. It will be the student's responsibility to notify me at least 2 days in advance of coming in to retake the assessment.

Homework:

Because computer and internet utilization is required for most class work, homework will be limited to unfinished classwork. When possible, students will be asked to gather information for projects and reports that may be required. Studying for tests and completing unfinished typing lessons will be the only necessary work at home.

Classroom Procedures and Expectations

Students are expected to follow class and school guidelines for behavior.

Classroom rules are as follows:

- Be on time
- Students will not be permitted to have their book bags with them at their seats during class. This means that they must gather their materials from their book bags before class begins
- Enter quietly and sit in your assigned seat
- Respect others and their belongings
- No food, drink, or gum allowed
- Do not damage equipment, if something is not working it is the student's responsibility to let me know
- Work only on the computer assigned to you
- Workstation must be cleaned, and materials returned to proper places before being dismissed
- No electronic items (cell phones, iPods and the like should be turned OFF and put AWAY) If I see it I take
- Take personal responsibility for your attitude, your behavior and your progress

Behavior issues:

Behavioral issues or failure to follow rules will result in the following consequences:

- 1. Verbal warning
- 2. Parent/Guardian notification if behavior continues
- 3. Detention Detention must be served on the **Wednesday (4:15 PM 5:00 PM)** after the detention notice is received. Parents/Guardians will sign the notice and the student will bring it to detention. If the detention form is not signed and brought to detention, the student will not be permitted to serve detention, and will be referred to his/her grade level administrator.

Extra Help Sessions

Students will have the opportunity to come in and receive extra help or to work on missing assignments on Wednesday afternoons from 4:15 PM - 5:00 PM. Advanced notice would be greatly appreciated.

Absences:

Any time you are absent you will have two school days after you return to make up any missed homework or missed inclass work for full credit. It is *your responsibility*, not mine, to make sure that you find out what the missing work is and that I check your missed work for you within this time frame. (i.e. If you return on a Tuesday, I need to see the assignment by Friday; If you return on a Wednesday, I need to see the assignment by Monday, etc.)
